July 4th Fireworks Spectacular Monday, July 4, 4 to 10:30 p.m. at Tumbleweed Park

Come to Chandler's Tumbleweed Park (located on the southwest corner of McQueen and Germann roads) on July 4, from 4 to 10:30 p.m., for your good old-fashioned, family friendly fireworks show. Pack your bags, bring your blankets and chair, and don't forget the sunscreen. Enjoy the award-winning park and all it has to offer: Playtopia, sand volleyball, horseshoes, and our newest addition, cornhole. Or, bring the fun from home: kites, Frisbees, sports balls, bikes, bubbles, jump ropes and so much more. Food and non-alcoholic beverages will be available for purchase throughout the evening. After all the family-made fun, sit back, relax, and watch the 20- to 25-minute fireworks show presented by the City of Chandler.



Safety Reminders:

- Whether you are planning to attend a public fireworks display or a barbecue, picnic or bike ride, please celebrate safely.
- Don't forget about four-legged friends this holiday. Try to keep pets indoors, or otherwise secured. The unexpected bang of a firework can startle pets and result in uncharacteristic reactions.
- Fires, potentially serious burns, as well as hand and eye injuries, can result from the use of fireworks, especially when young children are involved.
- The sale of permissible consumer fireworks is allowed from May 20 through July 6.
- The use of permissible consumer fireworks is allowed on private property, with the permission of the property owner, from June 24 through July 6.
- Chandler prohibits the use of permissible consumer fireworks on any public property, including City-owned or managed land, buildings and facilities. This includes public parks, public school facilities, public retention basins, and public roads and streets within Chandler City limits.


Changes to trash and recycling collection 4th of July week

Summer reading program begins

Summer Reading Program at Chandler Public Library! Lace up your sneakers and grab your water bottle. The 2016 Summer Reading Program at the Chandler Public Library starts on June 1, and runs through August 1. The theme of this year's program is "On Your Marks, Get Set ... READ!" This theme focuses on fitness, movement, sports, health and wellness and will be used in a variety of ways during programs throughout the summer.

In addition to each library location hosting their own "kickoff" events, they also will have programs about Chandler's Sports History, nutrition and fitness tips, crafts, and movies, before closing out the reading program with a bicycle rodeo.

In addition to promoting a healthy body, each participant, regardless of age, will be challenged to read 1,000 minutes and track it online through Maricopa County Library District's website. Tracking forms will be available for children so that they will be able to easily monitor their reading time themselves, which then can be logged later by an adult or teen volunteer at one of our libraries. Teens will be able to enter for raffle prizes, including an iPad mini and adults can enter to win a FitBit.
